


#### Housing







## **Bosch invests \$1.5B+ in Greater Sacramento**

Bosch's first chip manufacturing plant in the U.S. and third in the world

- Acquired assets of the chipmaker TSI Semiconductors, based in Roseville, California
- Goal is to manufacture silicon carbide chips for electric vehicles
- Received \$25M CalCompetes tax credit and \$10M in local utility incentive



#### FUTURE MOBILITY

#### **ZEV innovation hub**

Sacramento State-led innovation center to develop zero-emission vehicle technology

- 115,000 sq.-ft. manufacturing and R&D building for zero-emission technology
- Industry partners include Tesla, Bosch, Rivian, Lion Electric, Siemens and Volektra
- Workforce training and engineering programs being developed
- Bosch to support innovation discovery due to access of workforce and potential acquisition targets



#### **The Growth Factory**

Startup accelerator and venture fund based in Placer County

#### **Placer Outlook:** Public Safety Careers\*

- Fire and police agencies note existing and projected staffing shortages, especially for entry-level and experienced law enforcement and firefighting positions
- The number of awards from police and fire academies is a quarter to half of the number of projected occupation openings for firefighters, police and sheriff's patrol officers in the Greater Sacramento region. Example: Police academies produced 146 awards on average annually while the fiveyear projection of annual openings for police and sheriff's patrol officers is 596
- First responder (EMT and paramedic) medical training represents a major staffing and recruitment challenge for local firefighting agencies


